

July 2021 Librarian's Report Bradford Public Library

## Administrative:

The library has resumed normal operating hours, no appointment needed. Masks are no longer required for entry but encouraged for those who have not yet been vaccinated. Very few curbside requests have been made.

Gail is representing the library on the steering committee for the Bradford Community Visit sponsored by the Vermont Council on Rural Development. (<a href="www.vtrural.org">www.vtrural.org</a>) The purpose of the Community Visit program is to engage and bring together all members of the community to set common goals and directions in a neutral and facilitated structure, and to access necessary resources to move forward and take action on those goals. VCRD provides the structure and neutral facilitation.

Step one took place on Tuesday, June 29 bringing local business owners, and some community leaders who are committed to this process and opportunity for Bradford. The second step of this three step process will take place on Weds, July 28 with open forums for citizens to set and participate in community goals. BPL will offer childcare by way of three story hour program sessions, 2:30-4, 4:15 - 5:45, and 7-8:30 to support parents. A community wide dinner is a part of this process that day taking place at the Grace Methodist Church from 6- 7pm. Step three moves the goals forward and keeps the community informed on the progress with support from VCRD throughout.

#### **Grants:**

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding for Purchases and Supplies. BPL is eligible for \$4111.27. Funds were allocated based on a formula that includes a base dollar amount per person served, poverty and unemployment factors in the library's service area, and broadband availability. BPL will use this money to update the staff computers with one 2021 iMAC at the circulation desk, and one 2021 Microsoft Surface laptop totaling \$4076.54. The remaining \$34.73 will be used to purchase program supplies.
