Technology

The legacy OverDrive app is no longer available to download from the Apple App Store, Google Play, or the Microsoft store*. Users who have the OverDrive app (mobile or desktop) installed will still be able to use it without disruption. Later this year, we'll receive more details on how OverDrive app users will be encouraged to switch to Libby and the plans and timing for the eventual retirement of the OverDrive app.

The Vermont Department of Libraries (VTLIB)has contracted with two eBook and eAudiobook content providers, LYRASIS and Baker & Taylor. Both vendors provide a huge range of eContent from a wide variety of publishers. This collaboration will provide free access to their **Palace** app to all Vermonters through their local public libraries. The Palace app aggregates eBook and eAudiobook content from multiple vendors into a single interface, increasing access, ease of use, and appeal. The Palace app will access content from Baker & Taylor as well as from Listen Up Vermont! (LUV), the statewide eBook and eAudiobook platform administered by the <u>Green Mountain Library Consortium</u> (GMLC). This additional content will be appreciated by our growing number of audio/ebook users!
