

July 2022 Librarian's Report Bradford Public Library

Administrative:

Double staffing has enabled us to make steady progress on 'behind the scenes' library maintenance. The challenge of shelf-reading, cleaning and reorganizing materials, especially in high use areas, has been significantly affected. We have begun to inventory the non-fiction collection to match the catalog and support item retrievability for patrons and librarians.

With the summer season we are welcoming many visitors eager to see the inside of "the castle." Better yet are the folks returning to the area, happy to find this old friend alive and well. All are impressed by the updates, activity, and share personal memories in this *gem of a building*.

Although Tues and Weds program attendance is lower than we had hoped, those who do participate are engaged and enjoying the programs. Many are those kids who live within walking distance of the library. It is especially satisfying when a young person feels welcome to join no matter their age, and comfortable enough to ask for a meal without fear of judgment. This is but one simple example confirming the role our small rural library plays in supporting social inclusion and well being in the community.
