

April 13, 2023 Librarian's Report Bradford Public Library

Administrative:

The library is jumping with programming bringing in members of the community who are new to the building and library services. We had twenty folks in temporary housing meet with a representative from *The Haven*, a private, non-profit organization that serves people struggling with poverty by providing food, shelter, education, service coordination, and other support. All were new to the library, three registered for patron accounts and either borrowed a book, used the computers, wi-fi, or signed in to the Green Mountain Library Consortium. Meanwhile, thirteen folks are downstairs playing Mahjong with more coming for the Cricut program at 4:00pm. The new bi-weekly D&D gaming program has begun as well! BPL has something for everyone and nothing is better for librarians than the smile and thanks we get from a new library user.

The *Hands That Speak* program with Dartmouth lecturers Clara Maria de Greiff, Doug Moody, and special guests Paco & Juanita offered a wonderfully enlightening evening of authentic Mexican food and conversation surrounding the plight of our local migrant farm workers. We have applied to participate in the Palace Project. This is an eBook and eAudiobook service which is available to all public libraries in the state at no cost. The Palace App allows patrons to checkout items like other similar services, but its most significant feature is the ability to combine content from multiple e-content vendors including LIBBY into one app, rather than having to switch between multiple apps. The statewide collection includes eBooks and eAudiobooks for all ages and in multiple languages. Fingers Crossed we can jump on board during this phase of the collaboration!
