The weather cooperated beautifully and Ken Keating of Keating Painting was able to complete the project of scraping, caulking and painting the exterior windows before the rain returned. Many patrons have commented on the fresh look and appreciate the task of maintaining the building. Most noticeable are the front doors and trim which Ken scrubbed, dried, and painted in time for Story Hour on that Friday. Ken pointed out a few spots needing attention and will speak with his son about thoughts on replacing a few boards. There is also some mortar degradation which may be a problem considering water damage. Lastly, there is some trim which was not part of the estimate and may be addressed at a future date. Ken will write up an estimate for this job. One week later, a nest has been constructed above the front door which we will leave undisturbed...

# **Technology**

Technology specs and forms have been submitted and we should be up and running in the Palace Project by June. This eBook and eAudiobook service allows patrons to check out items like other similar services, but its most significant feature is the ability to combine content from multiple e-content vendors including LIBBY into one app, rather than having to switch between multiple apps. The statewide collection includes eBooks and eAudiobooks for all ages and in multiple languages.

The new printer is set up. Library staff are more familiar with device capabilities and most patrons are able to use the device independently.
