

August 10, 2023 Librarian's Report Bradford Public Library

Administrative:

At the board's suggestion, an attempt was made to deter folks from loitering and abusing library property by turning off the internet during closed hours. Unfortunately, this interrupted the alarm system. A call was made to Alarmco hoping to resolve this issue without a response. Since then we continue to offer open wi-fi 24/7 outside of the building for the whole community. While trash around the east side of the building has subsided, the front steps continue to be marred by trash, cigarette butts, tobacco, and other unknown stains. Oden Schlager spent some time with a power washer without much success in reviving the appearance of the granite. I scrubbed it again with vinegar, a drop of Dawn detergent and water with no effect.

The Working Group on the Status of Libraries in Vermont is studying staffing levels at Vermont libraries.
