Mission Statement

The Bradford Public Library is committed to supporting and enhancing learning, creativity, and opportunities for personal growth and community connections with reliable information and resources, and the support necessary to navigate those resources in a safe and welcoming environment.

Administrative:

Librarians are looking forward to a fresh start for the new year! The staffing schedule is working well and library visits have grown considerably with programming and patron support. Folks who are new to Bradford are becoming patrons almost daily! All are pleased with the services we provide as they become familiar with the area. The library is a great place to make new friends for all ages whether at story hour or over a game of mahjong. Others find comfort or perhaps relief from isolation in this socially active atmosphere.

Professional Development:

Adult Mental Health training; 9:00am - 12:30pm, Thursday, January 25, 2024 9:00am - 12:30pm, Thursday, February 1, 2024 Washington County Mental Health will present this online 2-part training on Adult Mental Health First Aid (MHFA), a skills-based training course that teaches participants about mental health and substance-use issues. Participants will be introduced to the <u>ALGEE</u> plan which will provide tools to support adults who are struggling until professional help arrives. MHFA also strives to reduce stigma around mental health challenges and focuses on the importance of early intervention to support better outcomes. *The class includes 2 hours of independent pre-work online in addition to the synchronous sessions.*

Technology:

We are keeping our eyes open for funding possibilities and hope to update our projector and conferencing tools for better virtual programs and meetings this year. Going along with this idea, we are also thinking about blackout treatments for the upper 'half moon' windows in the Reading Room.


Donations:

Dungeons & Dragons (D&D)

Adult campaign runs bi-weekly from 5-8pm in the YA Room.Dungeons & Dragons is a fantasy tabletop role-playing game (RPG) where the players form an adventuring party who explore fantasy worlds together as they embark on epic quests and level up in experience. This game has introduced 6-8 folks in their late twenties and early thirties to the library.

Mahjong

Mahjong emerged in China in the 1800s and became popular in the Jewish American community by the mid-20th century. Like many programs we offer at BPL, the game's history offers an interesting lens through which to see the intersection of people from different backgrounds and create a sense of belonging and community. Learn to play Mahjong each Thursday from 2 - 4pm. Experienced players help us learn. No experience necessary, experienced players welcome! 8-12 committed mahjong players participate each week.

Spanish Language / Conversation group

The group meets every Tuesday at 1:30 with at least ten learners in attendance and new members each week.

The Friday After School Program for elementary school aged children meets each week from 3-4:30pm with a focus on crafting and social skills. During this time one of our younger patrons is making new friends through teaching others to play the game of

'Magic - The Gathering' which is a tabletop roleplaying game. A donation of \$125 worth playing cards were donated by the family so that others can play and learn.

Toddler Story Hour ~ Join Ms. Gail and sometimes Waldei each Friday at 10am, with stories, songs and crafts. Parents and caregivers appreciate Story Time as an [affordable] opportunity for children and their adults to make new friends, share with others, and practice fine motor skills.
