2023 Reflection






Administration

2023 and double staffing has given librarians time to offer more programs and hone data collection for insight and reporting. The numbers support our efforts to continue or make changes to library materials, use of space, and how patrons access resources.

2023 Circulation Stats help us recognize trends and patron interest. Understanding how folks access library materials helps support our collection development.





Visitor Tracking

2023 reports show 1586 registered patrons with a total of 9584 visits for the year. A total of 2770 participants attended 355 programs held at the library!

Collaborations

BPL works collaboratively with many individuals, agencies, and organizations to broaden outreach and support efforts that could not easily be done alone. Capstone, Space On Main, Hub Teen Center, Children's Literacy Foundation (CLiF), Everyone Eats, VT Humanities, Old Church Theater, the Peace Education Program, Little Rivers, Star Cat Books, HireAbility VT, Mentoring Project, VT Early Literacy (VELI), HIV/HCV Resource Center, Bradford Parks and Recreation, the local homeschool community, and more.

Programs

Library programs are free and open to the public. This helps fill the human need for community, connection, and entertainment while encouraging social interaction outside of typical social groups.

Popular ongoing programs include:

Poetry Circle, Spanish Conversation, Mahjong, Dungeons & Dragons, BPL CREATE!-Adult Crafting, BPL READS!-Book Discussion, Toddler Story Hour, Friday Afterschool program.

Special Programs:

Guest authors, Poet Laureates and published poets, Bradford Poem Town, teen drama camp, multiple summer reading programs, book giveaways, guest speakers, film screenings, school visits, gardening program, teen wellness.

Grants

Grant funding plays an important role in maintaining our historic building and continuing to provide cultural activities for the public. Librarians continuously seek funding opportunities to help support programs and upgrades. In 2023 BPL received a matching grant from the Preservation Trust of Vermont to repair and maintain all the window casings on the building.
