Administrative:

The following is taken from the July 2023 report;

July 2023~ Warning; this content may be unsuitable for some....

The summer season and, perhaps coincidentally, the ending of the ARPA housing relief program has brought new challenges to BPL. Librarians are seeing more folks dependent on resources including wifi, the restroom, a cool or dry place to rest, and/or to recharge physically and electronically. Unfortunately library staff have come to work finding books from the free shelf torn apart and discarded under the book drop smeared with blood, and in two cases used as TP alongside a pile of human feces. After the long weekend, well over a dozen cigarette butts and other trash needed to be cleared from the front steps. Other days were met with the need to douse the steps with boiling water to clear vomit and phlegm.

What difference a year can make;

July 2024 ~ The library is busy as ever and without incident regarding unhoused or otherwise marginalized members of the community. A call from the Valley News looking for an update is a reminder of all we faced last year, and questions about what may have changed.

As librarians settle into the comfort and security of having two staff on duty during open hours, general resources and programs thrive and function effectively. Staff are better able to serve folks, troubleshoot technology and *extinguish little fires* on any given day. Being available to attend and be fully present at programs and throughout the day helps to support library goals and objectives.

Staffing

Anna Peart is available and working with us as a substitute staff member this summer! It is a relief to have a veteran and experienced BPL librarian at the desk at a moment's notice. Librarians and patrons are thrilled to see Anna again!

Grants:

Once again BPL has been awarded the CLiF Summer Readers grant offering a book giveaway and children's author presentation. Storyteller Simon Brooks will be in Bradford with a few cases of quality children's books for every child present to pick out two titles to keep. This event will take place on July 19, 10am, in Elizabeth's Park.

Donations:

A \$50 donation was made by the RONDO group as thanks for a talk given by Larry Coffin. Thank you Larry for continuing to support the library behind the scenes!

h2rc.org ~ HIV/HCV Resource Center continues to supply us with Narcan and Fentanol test strips FREE to the community. We have a supply box situated on the shelf above the Little Library on our front porch which we refill weekly and more.

Technology:

GMLC~ Listen Up Vermont is in the process of adding a movie streaming service for our patrons as soon as September 1. BPL has registered with a commitment of \$0.30 per patron. The cost to our collection will be approximately \$400
