Mission Statement

Administrative:

The tax season is upon us with many requests for technical support, printing, and especially faxing as BPL has the only public fax service in town.

We continue to receive an abundance of positive response toward recent programs, the newsletters, BPL Gallery, and the general atmosphere of the library! Daily programs, meetings, computer use and 'everything library' keep librarians busy!

Grants:

BPL received a generous donation from the Donald and Harriet Peterson Charitable Fund "To be used for General operating expenses; in memory of Margaret Jenkins Pratt."

A \$1500 VELI grant was directly deposited and itemized for children's programming & needs.

BPL was notified on March 4 that we have been awarded up to \$1000 through the *Literacy Enrichment Grant for Spring 2024* from the Children's Literacy Foundation. This funding will pay for a Puppetry workshop for families and the No Strings Marionette Company scheduled to perform on April 20, at the Bradford Academy Building auditorium.

We have not yet heard back from Washington Electric on our request for \$600 through their community grant to cover the cost of formatting, printing, and other Poemtown expenses.

Summer Reading grant application for \$300 was submitted to the VT Department of Libraries for children's summer performance or other summer programming.

Donations:

Colatina Exit donated a certificate for 1 Lg pizza, 2 Liter soda, and family salad for the very exciting Jigsaw Puzzle Challenge.

A random \$300 donation came in and handed over to AA deposit

MIchelle Sherburne of the JO called and thanked us for hosting the Bradford Selectboard forum with some free advertising in coming editions. This will be especially helpful for Poemtown marketing.

Old Church Theater will donate a season's pass as a Library Program Prize.

Professional Development:

As a result of participating in the Mental Health First Aid course, BPL will host a training open to the community in May. The course will be presented by Christalee Kinney and Paige Stevens from the Clara Martin Center. It will take place on a Tuesday in May, and Gail participated in the Adult Mental Health training on January 25, and February 1, 2024 Washington County Mental Health presented this online 2-part skills-based training course that teaches participants about mental health and substance-use issues. The class included 2 hours of independent pre-work online in addition to the synchronous sessions.

Technology:

The seed catalog is full and ready to share. High Mowing seed packets are cataloged and folks may take what they need and swap what they don't!

Dungeons & Dragons (D&D)

Adult campaign runs bi-weekly from 5-8pm in the YA Room. Dungeons & Dragons is a fantasy tabletop role-playing game (RPG) where the players form an adventuring party who explore fantasy worlds together as they embark on epic quests and level up in experience. This game has introduced 6-8 folks in their late twenties and early thirties to the library.

Mahjong

Mahjong emerged in China in the 1800s and became popular in the Jewish American community by the mid-20th century. Like many programs we offer at BPL, the game's history offers an interesting lens through which to see the intersection of people from

different backgrounds and create a sense of belonging and community. Learn to play Mahjong each Thursday from 2 - 4pm. Experienced players help us learn. No experience necessary, experienced players welcome! 8-12 committed mahjong players participate each week.

Spanish Language / Conversation group

The group meets every Tuesday at 1:30 with at least ten learners in attendance and new members each week. Latino inspired foods are served each week!

The Friday After School Program for elementary school aged children meets each week from 3-4:30pm with a focus on crafting and social skills. During this time one of our younger patrons is making new friends through teaching others to play the game of 'Magic - The Gathering' which is a tabletop roleplaying game. A donation of \$125 worth playing cards were donated by the family so that others can play and learn.

Toddler Story Hour ~ Join Ms. Gail and sometimes Waldei each Friday at 10am, with stories, songs and crafts. Parents and caregivers appreciate Story Time as an [affordable] opportunity for children and their adults to make new friends, share with others, and practice fine motor skills.

Crazy 8's Math Club ~ This eight week program begins on March 27 from 3 - 4pm. Registration is required as space is limited. Volunteers Kelli Young, and Adri Petrossian are working with Gail as we build stuff, run & jump, make music, (make a mess), a totally new kind of math club! The club will not meet during April school break.
