Mission Statement

Administrative:

Fall planning is underway with a focus on adult programming, homeschool support, year-end reporting, and the ongoing challenge of maintaining and growing our web presence. More than ever before, the library serves as a meeting space for families, community groups, and organizations. Being the only private space, our Vermont Room, however small, is reserved almost daily. The new school year has reclaimed the OESU parking lot, and lack of convenient parking is once again the topic of conversation upon entering the library!

On Tuesday, September 17, BPL will be the featured library on the podcast 'Where the Books Are Now' highlighting Vermont Public Libraries. Each week, host Nancy Tusinski talks with a library director or staff member from a Vermont Public Library about what makes that library special, gather some book recommendations, and discover some not-so-well-known treasures, collections, and services available to library patrons.

Maintenance:

The recent dry weather gave us an opportunity to shampoo the carpets in the children's room on Sunday, September 1. What a difference! Grants:

Kelli has supported me as a volunteer in the children's room with the Crazy 8's Math Club. Inspired by the day's activities and literacy discussion among librarians at the conference, Kelli asked if she could be of more help with children's programming! Win, win, win....

Grief & Loss Support Group:

The Visiting Nurse and Hospice of VT & NH (VNH) Grief & Loss Support Group provides a facilitated experience with a small group of others who have experienced the loss of a loved one and want support around the grieving process. Sessions are facilitated to create a safe environment in which you can share authentically and feel deeply heard. There will be experiential exercises including journaling and ritual to help you gently expose the layers of grief and move toward greater acceptance.

The group will run for six weeks at BPL on Wednesdays from 3:30-5pm beginning September 4 and running through October 9. Pre-registration is required and the current group is full.
