Including Charitable Gifts in Your Plans

When you have reached the final steps in preparing your will and estate plans, you will no doubt be pleased and relieved that you have taken care of these important responsibilities.

There is one last consideration: If your family or others named in your plans are not there to benefit, have you made contingency arrangements?

A contingent gift occurs only if other beneficiaries are unavailable or in the event of a specific occurrence (such as the prior death of a loved one). Unless a contingent beneficiary is named, your property might pass to distant relatives you may not even know.

Leaving your legacy:

Charitable organizations are often named as contingent beneficiaries in wills and other estate plans. Your attorney can easily include such language in your will and/or other plans, if you desire.

Other ways to give:

Your will is not the only vehicle you can use to make a gift of the remainder of your estate. Other ways to give include:

- **Life Insurance.** You can name the Bradford Public Library as a final beneficiary of a life insurance policy.
- **Retirement Plans.** It's easy to include the library as a beneficiary of your retirement plan assets.
- **Living Trusts.** If you use a living trust to distribute some of your assets, you can include Bradford Public Library.

An attractive feature of all these plans? None is a permanent designation; they can be changed in your direction. You can feel free to modify your "gift of a lifetime" at any time.
