Mission Statement

Administrative:

Banned Books Week 2025 took place from October 5–11, 2025, with the theme "Censorship Is So 1984. Read for Your Rights".

Donations:

Grants:

BPL has been awarded 50 copies of the 2025 Vermont Reads title *A Light Pirate*, by Lily Brooks-Dalton through the Vermont Humanities Council. This award includes a discussion led by a trained facilitator. We have invited Jim Schley who has been leading book discussion groups for twenty years and has taught for Community College of Vermont and The Frost Place, where he was executive director. At Dartmouth College he majored in Literature and Creative Writing and minored in Native American Studies, and he has an M.F.A. in poetry from Warren Wilson College. Books are available at the circulation desk and we look forward to hosting this discussion on October 23, at 6:30pm.

Maintenance:

Technology:

The end-of-support date for Windows 10, arrived Oct. 14, 2025 impacting our public computers, (as well as patron-owned and maybe some staff owned computers.)
