## **Mission Statement**

The Bradford Public Library is committed to supporting and enhancing learning, creativity, and opportunities for personal growth and community connections with reliable information and resources, and the support necessary to navigate those resources in a safe and welcoming environment.

## **Administrative:**

This month I want to recognize our librarians and the roles we play in supporting the community with technology. On a daily basis we help folks set up personal computers, tablets, phones, access patron accounts, LIBBY Overdrive, etcetera. Folks rely on us, sharing personal information in order to meet basic needs and demands. Job applications, unemployment filings, medical portals and health documents, bill pays, IRS filings, divorce proceedings, child custody status, and more. It is an honor to be trusted, a privilege to serve in this way. I am proud of, and grateful to all staff at BPL.

The season is in full swing with children's programming and summer reading challenges. Our youngest patrons are excited for the annual summer reading incentives including "how many in the jar", reading logs to earn an ice cream cone at The Mill, and entering to win a remote control LEGO Building kit and other prizes!

The new owner at the Bridge Weekly gave us a full page spread which was published on July 3. This is a collaborative effort between area libraries where we each took a week to let the public know what is happening in our libraries.

A few remote workers have been asking how the library might 'fill the gap' with the recent changes to the *Space on Main*.

We had a special guest visit on the evening of July 3 ... .a grey squirrel dashed in through the front door and ran a few laps around the mezzanine before we were able to open a

The new 86" Viewsonic Displayboard is up and running thanks to Arvid and Nathan Johnson. This display board acts as a computer allowing us to connect to any search engine, share content via screen casting software, with clear and vivid images. This purchase was funded by the American Library Association Access Grant.
