Administrative:

Fridays are exciting and fun as we welcome new families to story hour each week! As the season settles, gardens are put to bed for winter, and the school year gets underway, adult programming will resume for the cooler months ahead.

Professional Development:

Vermont Early Literacy Fall Conference ~ Gail > Lake Morey, Monday, September 8. BPL has been a member of VELI since its inception in 2010. 21 VELI libraries represent a diversity in geography, size, audience, and experience. Shared insights among the group are invaluable in supporting early literacy programming in our community library.

Grants:

BPL has been awarded 50 copies of the 2025 Vermont Reads title *A Light Pirate*, by Lily Brooks-Dalton through the Vermont Humanities Council. This award includes a discussion led by a trained facilitator. We have invited Jim Schley who has been leading book discussion groups for twenty years and has taught for Community College of Vermont and The Frost Place, where he was executive director. At Dartmouth College he majored in Literature and Creative Writing and minored in Native American Studies, and he has an M.F.A. in poetry from Warren Wilson College. Books are available at the circulation desk and we look forward to hosting this discussion on October 23, at 6:30pm.

Maintenance:

Custom window treatments for the upper windows in the Reading Room were installed on Monday, September 15. This project was paid for through the ALA LTC Access grant.

Technology:

Reminder: the upcoming end-of-support date for Windows 10, on Oct. 14, 2025 impacts our public computers, (as well as patron-owned and maybe some staff owned computers.) Windows 11 has a series of specific hardware requirements, which means many semi-recent computers that are otherwise totally usable aren't able to upgrade. Our PC's do not meet the minimum system requirements to run Windows 11. We could do nothing, and use the computers as-is. But the operating system will not get security updates, leaving patron privacy at risk which becomes more and more concerning as time goes along.

Chris Bandy does IT for SouthWest Airlines. Chris explained a number of changes we can make in the tech closet to secure wiring, and make better use of our network in general. He has suggestions for PC purchase to support the needs of our patrons.

Volunteers:

Working with a JOBS Vocational Counselor at the Clara Martin Center, we are supporting a young person interested in a possible career in library services. Lucas will be working with us as a volunteer for a few months, with pay from the program at Clara Martin.
